SCIENCE ON A SPHERE Rm 220

Science On a Sphere® (SOS) is a room-sized, immersive global display system that uses computers and video projection to display planetary data onto a four-foot diameter carbon fiber sphere, simulating a giant animated globe. With over 600 datasets collected by satellites from NOAA and NASA, SOS is a powerful educational learning tool designed to help illustrate Earth system and planetary science to people of all ages. Animated images which are used to explain complex environmental processes provide an immersive learning experience that is captivating, unlike no other.
